

Pupil Premium Spend 2015/16

The school was allocated £23420 in pupil premium for the financial year 2015/16, of which £3472 was Looked After Children (LAC) pupil premium. Due to the transient nature of the cohort the full grant allocation was received throughout the year. An initial grant of £14960 was allocated to the school at the beginning of the financial year based on the January census.

The table below illustrates how the pupil premium was spent. A significant proportion of the grant was targeted at individual pupils attracting the grant whilst a whole school approach was taken to other interventions in order to raise standards.
